- 1. What are the 3 main parts of a tree?

 Crown, trunk, and the roots. (page 8)
- 2. What do roots do for a tree?

 Hold the tree in place, and absorb water and nutrients for the tree. (page 9)
- 3. What is the most massive tree?

 The giant sequoia. (page 17)
- 4. Approximately how many species of trees are there in the U.S. and Canada? Nearly 1,000. (page 21)
- Name some animals that might live in or around a tree.
 Birds, squirrels, bugs, bats, worms, and chipmunks. (pages 25 and 35)
- 6. What are some species of trees that are used for firewood? Ash, beech, birch, hickory, and oak. (page 29)
- 7. What are some products that come from trees?

 Paper, furniture, chewing gum, cough syrup, paint, shampoo, lumber. (page 29)
- 8. What is an invasive species?

 A plant or animal that does not naturally belong in an area and upsets the ecological balance by harming the original plants and animals. (page 30)
- 9. What is a deciduous tree?

 A tree that loses its leaves annually. (page 34)
- 10. What is a cavity on a tree?

 A hole in the tree that is important habitat for many animals (shelter, place to store food, raise young, sleep). (page 34)
